RITE AID CASE Defendants change pleas

HARRISBURG The remaining two defendants in the Rite Aid accounting scandal have agreed to change their pleas, a spokesman for the U.S. District Court said Wednesday.

Franklin C. Brown, the company's former chief counsel and board vice president, and Eric Sorkin, who is on administrative leave as the company's vice president for pharmacy purchasing, are scheduled to change their innocent pleas at separate hearings today, Courtroom Deputy Mark Armbruster said.

Sorkin is scheduled to enter a guilty plea, according to court documents. Other court documents said Brown will enter a change of plea, but provided no additional details.
